At All Saints', we provide a nurturing, faith-based education where academic growth, spiritual development, and character are equally valued. Rooted in the Judeo-Christian tradition through the Anglican faith, our mission is to help each child reach their highest potential while fostering compassion, service, and a love for learning. From our youngest learners in 2K through 6th grade, we create a supportive and inclusive community where children grow in knowledge, faith, and friendship.

Curriculum Snapshot

Our 1st Grade curriculum blends engaging, research-based programs to build strong foundational skills across all core areas:

- Reading & English Language Arts (McGraw Hill- Open Court and Guided Reading)
 - A comprehensive literacy curriculum that builds foundational skills through phonics, decoding, spelling, and high-frequency words, while developing fluency, comprehension, and beginning writing skills.
- Math (Sadlier-Progress in Mathematics and Prodigy)
 - A structured mathematics program designed to develop number sense, addition/subtraction fluency, and problem-solving through scaffolded lessons.
- Science (Scholastic, Mystery Science, Science Journals)
 - A rich, inquiry-based science curriculum covering topics such as animal life cycles, the sun and moon, natural resources, and plant environments—designed to spark curiosity and hands-on learning.
- Social Studies (Studies Weekly)
 - Interactive, story-based social studies instruction that brings communities, history, and civic themes to life in engaging, elementary-friendly formats.
- Handwriting (Zaner-Bloser)

Time-tested handwriting instruction, teaching manuscript with attention to posture, letter formation, and motor control.

The Life of a First Grader

Life in 1st Grade at All Saints' is filled with growth, discovery, and special traditions. Each day begins with a **Morning Meeting** to foster community, followed by **Chapel twice a week** and a **Friday Spirit Assembly**, which celebrates the school community together.

The school day is centered on **core subjects**, including reading, writing, math, science, and social studies. Each lesson begins with whole-group instruction and is followed by guided and independent practice, which may take the form of small-group work or individual activities.

Students enjoy a well-rounded education through special area classes each week, including **Art, Library, Music, STEM, Technology, PE, and Spanish**. They also participate in the **Accelerated Reader (AR) program**, encouraging independent reading and goal setting.

To track progress, students complete formal reading, math, and writing assessments three times a year, along with CogAT and lowa standardized testing each spring. Every student uses a **Chromebook** to support digital literacy and classroom learning.

A highlight of the year is "**Leader Reader**", where students proudly lead the class in a read-aloud, building confidence and presentation skills.
