Summer Reading Projects for Rising Sixth-grade Students



All Saints' Episcopal Day School Assignment # 1

Choose a biography. This book should be AR level 5.0 or higher. Once you have read the book, write three journal entries as if you are the person. Choose important days from the person's life about which to journal. Be sure to tell what day it is and what event had happened or was going to happen. Tell how you felt on this day and describe any other people who may have been a part of that day. Do not copy from the book UNLESS you want to quote something that another person said to you. As a whole, the three journal entries should give a good overview of some important events in the person's life as well as what the person is like and how he/she feels.

Entries should be done on notebook paper in your best cursive handwriting. Remember each entry should be between ½ and 1 page in length. Compile all summer work into one folder.



Assignment # 2

Choose a fiction book to read. This book must be AR level 5.0 or higher.

After reading the book, create a poster in collage-style for the book. This should be done on ½ size poster board. The collage should include the title of the book and the author's name. Then you may use markers, clip art, magazine cut-outs to create a collage of any symbols or words that are a part of the book. Pictures and drawings should be neatly placed on the poster and <u>there should be little or no white</u> <u>space</u>. Cover the board. Be prepared to do an oral report on this book in which you show your collage and tell about different aspects of the book. We will do this sometime during the first week of class.
